Stampede Recap! Great Lakes Stampede

e celebrated Armed Forces Day at the 30th Annual, Great Lakes Stampede All Ford & Mustang Car Show on Saturday, May 17th.

Traditionally, weather has been a factor in our shows back when we held them in September, and even in June. Some time ago, we moved the show to mid-May to change our luck. Again, intermittent showers, sprinkles and clouds dominated the day, along with some rain for attendees while driving to the show. Luck, as we all know, is a fickle thing!

Still, we had a good show with support from our member volunteers and our vendors, though the weather and vehicle issues hindered a couple of them.

The show began at 9:00 AM and ended with the Raffle drawings and Award presentation beginning at 1:00 PM. Registration took place from 9:00 to 11:00 AM, with just over 100 attendees.

We used the 2024 show as a template with a few tweaks here and there to further improve the show. Judged classes were virtually the same as last year. We did not offer a judging option for members this year primarily because there were only a handful of members that choose this option in 2024.

Volunteers received food vouchers as a "perk" for

their time and help in making the show a success.

Another tradition at the Stampede is our outstanding Raffle, and this year didn't disappoint. We had strong support from members and sponsors in providing raffle items, and equally strong support from attendees and members in raffle ticket sales. The "big raffle

prize" was a Mustang-style, compact refrigerator that was awarded with a separate "red" raffle ticket.




At the event, we'll still have our official business meeting, with the usual reports. Expect discussion on the Great Lakes Stampede as this will be our show wrap-up meeting, too.

Horsin' Around HorseSense 4.6

MCA Show = Nervous Attendee

Normally, I would give my perspective on MCMM's Great Lakes Stampede in this June HorseSense 4.6 column. Due to a more important family event on the 17th, I was unable to attend our own show this year. You

can read about it elsewhere, and - later - we'll have a few 2025 review and 2026 planning meetings on the Stampede and it's future.

Now, however, I'm focused on a new challenge: Attending a Mustang Club of America (MCA) show with my 2007 Mustang GT, "Vista Blue," a first for

me in several ways.

I was able to attend my first MCA show when it was held in Indianapolis back in July, 2023, but I was a "ride along" with MCMM member, Dick Lebsack. He invited me to ride shotgun in his 50th Anniversary, 2015 GT convertible, but his car was entered in the display category, so we didn't go through the rigorous detail cleaning process needed for a judged entry.

This year will be different for me as Vista

Blue will be attending, and will be judged. On the advise of our own MCA Gold Card judge, Quentin Levitte, I chose the "Daily Driver" class as that fits Vista's demeanor and status given the patina that has developed over her 18 years and almost 150,000 miles on the road. In this category, areas like the engine

compartment and the chassis are excluded from being judged, and some of Vista Blue's patina "may be" overlooked, though I doubt it.

I'll be following in the footsteps of MCMM members like the Bentleys, Levittes, Caesars, and many others that attended MCA shows and taken gold, silver and bronze awards home with them. Stan Bentley and Quentin have been successful not only in winning awards but by becoming Gold Card judges in the MCA. Bentley's 1968 California Special has passed beyond normal judging to be entered in the Conservator class and earned the required 20 points to gain an MCA Grill Medallion.

Horsin' Around In Memoriam



Remembering Harold "Hal" Sperlich 12.01.1929 - 01.20.2025

Harold "Hal" Sperlich was, among many other things, well known in Ford circles as the man that made the Mustang happen, and in Chrysler circles as the father of the minivan.

In the early 1960s, a new car designed from the ground up cost around \$400 million. Henry Ford II was reluctant to begin a new vehicle after the Edsel

failed, but did approve \$45 million for what would become the Mustang. Sperlich is the one credited for putting forth the idea of using the successful Falcon platform as the basis for the Mustang. Without Sperlich's original and key idea, the Mustang would not have happened.

Later, Sperlich had an idea for a small, front-engined van, and pushed the idea heavily to Henry to the point that he had "enough" and ordered Lee Iacocca to fire him in 1977. In his book, Mustang Genesis. Robert Fria, noted that it was said of Sperlich that he was considered by some as "too pushy, too bold, too abrasive too outspoken, but usually 100 percent right."


After leaving Ford, he wasn't without work long as Chrysler hired him. Iacocca, CEO at Chrysler, made him part of the

reorganization team to get the company out of massive red ink. Sperlich used his ideas to get the K-Car off the ground and then the minivan, which Henry Ford II had repeatedly rejected. While the K-Car helped resurrect Chrysler, it was Sperlich's minivan idea that saved the company. Said Sperlich, "If Henry Ford II had accepted my minivan concept, Chrysler would not exist."

Sperlich is survived by his loving wife, D'Anne Kleinsmith, M.D., his three children, and many grand, great-grand and step children.

As a tribute to his innovation at Ford, over 20 Mustangs were displayed at the memorial in front of his church, Kirk in the Hills, in Bloomfield Hills on Friday, May 30th.

Representing the MCMM at the memorial were members, Steve and Angie Caesar, Scott Roemmele, Mark and Elaine Suter, Jim Timmer, and Tom Welsh II. MOCSEM members, Angeline and Klaus Raddatz displayed their all original 1965 Mustang hardtop in front of the church.
